

Evening Concert/Workshop Performers

Tina Bergmann and Bryan Thomas are northeast Ohio-based folk artists performing an eclectic repertoire of traditional American, Celtic, and South American music. The much acclaimed duo performs on hammered dulcimer and bass with great warmth and technical skill, showcasing the breadth of the tonal range and timbre of the instruments.

Magpie (Terry Leonino & Greg Artzner) combine powerful voices with Greg's outstanding fingerstyle guitar and Terry's excellent harmonica, mandolin, mountain dulcimer, and guitar in a repertoire that includes traditional, classic country, swing, blues, and contemporary songs including originals. From Maryland, they've been together since 1973.

Lesley and Pauline Miller are a daughter and mother from Bowling Green. Lesley was the 2003 Regional hammered dulcimer champion from Roscoe Village Dulcimer Days and hammered and mountain dulcimer champion at Kentucky State in 2004 (with Pauline second in mountain dulcimer). Lesley has a CD They've been here the last two years.

Kathy Moser is a songwriter, performer, teacher and social artist, working to bring positive change to the world through music. She is from New Jersey and performs regularly throughout the Northeast. Known for her poetic lyrics and driving guitar style, her songs confront a variety of topics to leave audiences entertained, uplifted, thoughtful and motivated.

Karen Mueller is one of the top autoharp and mountain dulcimer players today. Her exciting and innovative performing style, features Appalachian, Celtic, and contemporary music. She also sings and plays guitar, mandolin, Irish bouzouki, and bass dulcimer. She is the 1986 International Autoharp Champion. Karen is from Minnesota.

Maureen Sellers is from New Albany, Indiana. Utilizing the wonderful drones of the mountain dulcimer, Maureen plays traditional music from the Appalachian and Ozark mountains. She also flatpicks songs to create waves of arpeggios that pull the listener into the music. Sing-alongs, gospel and sacred music are featured in her classes and concerts.

Dulci-More Members will add more workshops and short opening sets for each of the evening concerts.

Bill Schilling of Salem will again be our performing emcee for the concerts. He is a folk-style singer and multi-instrumentalist, leader of Dulci-More, and director (from the start) of the Dulci-More Festivals. Bill has several books and a recording with Linda Sigismondi. He is Music Coordinator and a regular instructor for Folk Music at Weatherbury Farm.

Mini-Concert/Workshop Performers

Mountain Marge Diamond is a Dulci-More member and founder of a group in Oberlin. She returns from Elyria with several lap dulcimers, tunes, and techniques. She has played at all of our festivals. She has a recording and now does airbrushed artwork of instruments on shirts.

Guy George is from Concord, Ohio and has been with us four times before. He plays hammered dulcimer, saxophones, flute, whistle, steel drum, and

keyboard. He has a CD with his wife, Sharrie, and has recorded with several others. This is his third year as one of our vendors.

Humours 'n Hammers includes Jan Douglass, Janet Harriman, Lois Mountz, and Joyce Strohecker all playing hammered dulcimer and more at times. They came together as Dulci-More members who enjoy playing intricate arrangements. They played Dulci-More Festivals 10 & 11.

Lisa & Heather Malyuk are sisters both attending the University of Akron. Starting with hammered dulcimer and guitar, they have added mountain dulcimer, banjo uke, fiddle, and nyckelharpa. They have appeared on Woodsongs Old Time Radio Hour and in Northern Ireland.

Gary & Toni Sager are known in the dulcimer world for vending Prussia Valley Dulcimers and now their Acoustic Music Shop in Waverly, OH as well (and this will be their first time vending here). Gary plays mountain dulcimer and Toni plays autoharp. They recently finished their first CD.

Linda Sigismondi is the leader of the Banks of the Ohio Dulcimer Club in Gallipolis and directs the Fort New Salem Dulcimer Festival. She has several books with companion CDs and a recording with Bill Schilling. A Dulci-More member, she has played all our festivals.

South Wind combines Annie Trimble and Curt Cooper from the Pittsburgh area. Both sing, and Annie adds guitar, mandolin, and banjo while Curt plays guitar, fiddle, and flute. They play traditional and contemporary folk music including Appalachian, Celtic, and originals.

Sutch Sounds consists of Adam Sutch on lead hammered dulcimer (Adam is a Freshman at California Area High School of Pennsylvania), his mother Michelle Sutch on back-up hammered dulcimer, and his grandparents, Ron and Darlene Howes on lead and rhythm guitars.

Sweet Sounds come from Dulci-More members Pat Carnahan and Sue Sabatino. They both sing with great harmonies. Pat plays mostly mountain dulcimer and Sue plays mostly hammered dulcimer (but both play several other instruments). They played Dulci-More Festivals 6-10.

Alice Whitehill returns again as a Dulci-More member from Hookstown, PA. She sings and plays dulcimers and more. She is often joined by Earl Whitehill or others. Alice is one of our vendors. Alice has been part of all of our Dulci-More Festivals.
